
The foundation of the TAFAWOQ 'Pentagon Model' rests upon the internationally recognised five dimensions of professionalism, as originally developed by the APM.






TAFAWOQ Learning

Face-to-face Phase: This classroom-based instruction phase ensures that you meet your instructors in real time, allowing for plenty of opportunities to expand upon the knowledge acquired in the virtual phase. The classroom-based instruction phase will also see you undertake group assignments while working with live case studies, based on real projects.



This is an introduction to hydrocarbon- and infrastructurecapital project management. The course introduces the following topics at a high level, aiming at raising awareness about the material:

- Business objectives of projects: Why companies do projects
- Project lifecycle and governance: project stage-gate process and senior management involvement in sponsoring projects
- Risk management: managing risks associated with projects, to allow better outcomes
- Stakeholder engagement: methods for identifying and engaging key stakeholders in projects
- Cost and schedule estimating: how to estimate costs and schedules associated with projects
- Team development and integration: defining a well-developed project team and how it can impact project performance

This course focuses on how scope, schedule, cost, quality and risk shape a project, and how control of these factors affects successful project delivery. During the course, the following topics will be addressed, and relevant capabilities developed by participants:

- Identifying and prioritising project objectives and controls (scope, cost, schedule, quality and risk)
- Utilizing project breakdown structures to improve project scope definition, planning, scheduling, resourcing and cost estimation
- Developing, resource loading, monitoring and controlling project schedules
- Understanding the basis of cost estimates, methods for estimating costs, as well as monitoring and managing project costs
- Preparing a coordinated project plan to align scope, schedule, resources and costs
- Integrating contractor data into the project plan and determining the status of work
- Forecasting project outcomes (completion and costs)
- Controlling project changes

Who should attend?

This course is designed for personnel who work on capital projects, with the following background and experience:

- Personnel with 2-5 years' experience, who work in a project services role (planning, scheduling, cost estimating, or project controls)
- Project engineers with limited experience in cost estimating, scope identification, planning, scheduling and project controls and 2-5 years of experience
- Technical disciplines, with 2-5 years of experience, wishing to gain more expertise in project services

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Essentials of Project Management







This course provides an indepth introduction to the major elements of project management; the principles, tools and processes for effective management of capital projects. It covers the entire lifecycle of project development, including establishment of the business case, front end development, execution and operations readiness. The following topics will be addressed, and relevant capabilities developed by the participants:

- Establishing the business strategy and business case
- Understanding how project economics are generated in support of the business case
- Understanding the impact of HSSE, quality assurance, and stakeholder engagement on project outcomes
- Developing project scope to deliver the business case
- Capital project risk management
- Understand the importance of developing, motivating and managing project teams; developing techniques and skills to improve team performance
- Create project schedules and resource allocations
- Develop contracting and procurement strategies for project execution
- Understand and manage project controls
- Control project changes

Participants who successfully complete the course with a minimum of 70% can take the APM Project Management Qualification exam.

Who should attend?

This course is designed for personnel who work on capital projects and have 3-5 years related experience, with the following backgrounds:

- Project Engineers
- Contracting and procurement professionals
- Technical discipline professionals
- Experienced technical hires, who need a background in project management tools and processes

Effective Project Contracting







This course focuses on formulating and managing the appropriate contracting and procurement strategies for successful execution of project scope and objectives. The course will give an understanding of alternative contracting strategies, when to use them and the impact of different approaches in multi-cultural environments. It also introduces tools that can help ensure effective project contracting.

The following topics will be addressed, and relevant capabilities developed by the participants:

- Evaluate stakeholders, markets and risks to develop optimal contract strategies that meet project objectives
- Develop appropriate contract scopes, pricing and terms and conditions to suit the requirement
- Identify, evaluate and select goods and service providers to invite for the tendering process
- Develop invitations to tender and tender evaluation plans to secure selection of the best contractor
- Develop an appropriate contract management plan
- Implement strategies and processes that support effective work relationships and contract management, and avoid / resolve claims and disputes

Who should attend?

This course is designed for personnel who work on or with capital projects, having the following background and experience:

- Senior Project Management professionals with 5-10 years related experience
- Senior Contracting and Procurement professionals with 5-10 years related experience

Pre-requisites:

- Contributing to Projects: TAFAWOQ introductory course
- Essentials of Project Management, TAFAWOQ foundation course

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This course is focused on identifying and managing project risks and opportunities to deliver successful project outcomes. This module uses proven methods to identify, evaluate, report and manage risks during project development and execution. It also addresses the impact of human influences and attitudes (including stakeholder expectations) on the decision-making process during the project lifecycle.

The following topics will be addressed, and relevant capabilities developed by the participants:

- Understanding uncertainty and risk, and their impact on individuals and groups in a project management environment
- Manage the risk process across the project lifecycle, and across all disciplines
- Support decision-making by trading-off project objectives (cost, time and quality) in relation to risks, to improve project outcomes

Who should attend?

- Project Managers with a minimum 5 years of experience on capital projects
- Professionals responsible for risk management of major projects

- Maintain and manage project schedules and resource allocations
- Apply techniques to validate the accuracy of schedules and cost estimates
- Maintain cost estimates and manage project costs
- Control project changes
- Analyze project performance and forecasts to recommend corrective measures
- Deliver the right information to the right people at the right time

- Senior Project Professionals with 5+ years' experience
- Senior Project Finance Personnel with 5+ years' experience
- Senior Project Services/Project Controls professionals with 5+ years' experience

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This course is intended for Project Managers, Project Engineers and Project Services Managers/Personnel who have completed the TAFAWOQ "Essentials of Project Management" course. What participants will learn:

The course introduces participants to the techniques and skills for improving the activities that a typical Project Manager/Engineer must accomplish once the Concept Selection Decision has been made for a project.

Specifically, the course offering will explore the following areas.

- Understanding the Concept Selection Decision and assumptions
- The work required and outputs to be delivered to pass through Decision Gates 3 & 4 (DG3 & DG4)
- Stakeholder Engagement
- Governance and Assurance
- Project Controls & Change Control / Management of Change
- Managing Risks and Integrating Risks into project plans
- Organising the Project Team
- Contracting & Procurement Strategy & Plans
- Quality and Process Safety

The course does not aim to teach the specific processes and standards that are implemented in the Define phase: there are other industry courses and online training that cover these in great depth. Rather, the course emphasis is on translating the Concept Selection Report (pre-DG3) into a project with potential for development and delivery, by preparing plans to enable efficient execution post-DG4. This delivery is the Project Manager's/Engineer's responsibility and is achieved through integration of various required processes and the management of the many influences on project development during the Select and Define phases.

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to achieve the following:

- Apply typical front-end development work processes within governance and project assurance requirements, in a manner that is efficient and effective for a specific project
- Plan, organise, estimate, manage and control front-end development activities, to produce quality deliverables that define scope and execution plans, and which are consistent with project goals and business needs
- Ensure development of HSSE that enables safe effective execution, commissioning, startup and long-term operation of the asset. Effectively manage the many influences that support risk response and appropriately engage stakeholders to achieve project execution within the agreed objectives

What participants will learn:

The course introduces participants to the techniques and skills for improving project execution activities required for project managers/engineers to successfully lead a project up to the Start Up phase.

Specifically, the course will explore the following areas:

- Manage detailed design activities
- Develop / implement construction processes
- Develop Operational Readiness and Assurance plans, ("Flawless" startup), including commissioning and startup plans
- Manage the Schedule and Resource Plan
- Implement Change Control Process
- Manage Contractor Performance and Quality Assurance

The objective of this course is to improve a participant's ability to deploy the strategies and tactics established during front-end Development; implement the project controls, detailed design, procurement, construction, quality and startup and handover processes; and manage the work done by external service providers (engineering and/or construction consultants and contractors). This also includes monitoring, validating, coordinating or managing the activities of other support groups. This course will provide participants with techniques and skills for improving management of detailed design, procurement, construction and startup activities and contracts, in order to realise the value created during front-end development.

Emphasis of course content will not be on teaching the specific processes and standards, with which the participants should already be familiar and are specific to each organisation. It will cover translating the front-end development deliverables into a completed asset that meets the business objectives, and can be successfully commissioned, started up and handed over to Operations for long term operation.

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Improve their ability to deploy the strategies and tactics established during Front-End Development, to ensure that commitments are met
- Effectively manage HSSE and Quality, to ensure integration into design and HSSE compliant construction, commissioning, startup and long-term operation of the asset
- Understand and manage the many interfaces that occur between contractors and work processes
- Apply and implement project controls, detailed design, procurement, construction, quality, startup and handover processes
- Manage the work done by external service providers (engineering and/or construction contractors) and internal service providers, including monitoring, validating, coordinating or managing the activities of internal support groups
